Thought for the week

A very interesting discussion took place during our Coffee Morning where questions about God, Faith and Baptism were discussed. It made me think of the many people who are out there who have questions about God or misconceptions of who God is and what He is like or even if He is there at all.

What does your faith mean to you?

How would you respond if someone was to ask you who God is?

How in practice is your faith revealed to others?

Is it a matter of just doing good things or is there something more?

In what ways do you or could you build up your spiritual life?

Does worship contribute to sustaining and building your relationship with our Heavenly Father?

The Gospels tell us very clearly to develop our relationship with our heavenly Father and to build up our spiritual life is more than just believing all though that is a good start.

‘Love the **Lord your God** from **your whole heart** and from **your whole** soul and from **your whole** mind and from **your whole** strength’ (Mark 12:30)

Briefly speaking, this verse means that **God** wants us to love **Him** with our **whole** being.

As the Psalmist says:
