Thought for the Week

Attending Mike's funeral service on Thursday was a very moving occasion and as with all funerals a tribute to his life was given. A testimony of what made Mike, Mike. His life and tributes of what others thought of him. We all have our own memories of Mike, the times we shared with him whether in worship here at St Francis Church, the individual conversations shared or at the social gatherings, maybe at the amazing BBQ's he and Penny shared with us in their garden.

At our own funerals, we will have others speak of us and what we meant to them, our worth!

But have you ever stopped to think for more than a passing moment your worth in God?

Let me ask you another question that may help us think a little deeper into that question.

I am sure most of us have heard of the story of the woman who poured perfume on Jesus's feet. We are told that Jesus was visiting a friend for dinner, and when this woman, a prostitute, heard that Jesus was in the village, she took her most expensive bottle of perfume over to the house. When she stood in the presence of Jesus, she was overcome with emotion as

she wept. She bent down and took her perfume and poured it on His feet.. The friend of Jesus was shocked, asking Jesus, "Don't you know what kind of woman you're allowing to touch you?" But Jesus said to His friend, "Her sins are forgiven! Her faith has saved her. She is able to go in peace." Jesus forgave her, comforted her, and defender her.

Do not let anyone make you question your worth in Jesus. No matter what you've done and where you've come from, Jesus has called you His own. He has called you worthy. He has called you forgiven. He goes before you, He comforts you, and He defends you, and then, in all love and beauty, He calls you to go in peace. That is pretty amazing!

And let us also remember our worth to Him is such that:

"God put His love on the line for us by offering His Son in sacrificial death while we were of no use whatever to Him". (Romans 5:8 The Message)

Let us take comfort and strength also in His promise for those who believe, trust in him

"I give them eternal life, and they will never perish – ever! No one will snatch them out of My hand". (John 10:28)
